		<p>KenGen Managing Director Eddy Njoroge will this afternoon be unveiled as the new chairman of Telkom Kenya Board. He was appointed to the board by France Telecom, which bought 51 per cent in the formerly state-owned telco in December 2007 making him the first Kenyan to occupy the position since the buyout. A board member representing the government said the French giant picked on Mr. Njoroge due to his knowledge on Kenya's economic and political terrain. Mr. Njoroge takes over from Marc Rennard, a France Telecom executive, in a move that will see Kenyans occupy five seats on Telkom Kenya's nine-member board.</p>
