Standard	25	<p>Sh3.5b power project to delay by three months</p> <p>Contractors of the Sh3.5billion Sang’oro Hydro Power Plant project will commence work in September and not this month as scheduled.</p> <p>The projects senior engineer Mr. Alfred Abiero said that the contractors will be picked in June and that the delay had been occasioned by the post-poll disturbance, which interfered with its evaluation in January and February. Once completed the Sang’oro project will add 21.2MW to the National Grid.</p>
Business Daily	11	<p>Africa needs reliable energy supply</p> <p>The writer John Krenchi who is the President and CEO, GE Energy went to Nigeria to meet President Umaru Yar’Adua to discuss ways to support the country’s energy development plan. GE was asked by the Nigerian Government to conduct assessment of the National Integrated Power Projects (NIPP), whose objective was to determine the current status of the seven sites under implementation and make recommendations on how to effectively bring gas turbine plants into operation.</p>
